NEW YORK, NY, May 20, 2011 - The Jack Brewer Foundation (JBF Worldwide) is pleased to announce their third JBF Global Ambassadors trip in support of the One Team 4 Haiti campaign in a continued effort to provide reconstruction in Haiti after the devastating 7.0 magnitude earthquake in 2010. Sponsored by Brewer Sports International, JBF Worldwide Global Ambassadors, consisting of several current and former National Football League (NFL) players, will travel alongside partners, Un Techo para mi País, the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), IDB YOUTH, A Ganar, L'Atletique D'Haiti and the Voilà Foundation to promote sports for development and recovery programs. The delegation will participate in several initiatives throughout the week to provide continued relief to the people of Haiti.

Traveling from May 23 – 27, the delegation is comprised of leaders in the sports, business and entertainment industry including **Marion Barber** (Dallas Cowboys Pro Bowl Running Back and CEO of Barberian Enterprises), **Marvin Austin** (NY Giants Defensive Tackle, 2011 2nd Round NFL Draft Pick), **Robert Quinn** (St. Louis Rams Defensive End, 2011 1st Round NFL Draft Pick), **Barrett Green** (Former NFL Linebacker, CEO of HealthMax and JBF Director of Global Ambassador), **Jack Brewer** (Former NFL Safety/Team Captain, Executive Director of JBF Worldwide and CEO of Brewer Sports International) and **Claudine Oriol** (Haiti native Hollywood Actress). Numerous JBF supporters, executives and volunteers from our partnering organizations will also accompany the delegation.

On January 26, 2010, The Jack Brewer Foundation teamed up with the Clinton Bush Haiti Fund, Trilogy International Partners/Voila, WellMax/Health Sun and Player Associations for the NFL, NBA, NHL and MLB to create the "One Team 4 Haiti" campaign to raise relief money for Haiti after their seismic earthquake. The campaign raised funds to provide three stages of aid to Haiti: 1) Immediate needs for food, water and medical attention; 2) Mid-term needs for food, water, medicine and shelter; 3) Long term rebuilding and recovery. This year's return trip will focus on the third stage and aims to pave the way for economic growth for the people of Haiti.

"This visit is an extremely important forward step for JBF Worldwide, the One Team 4 Haiti program and all of our partnering organizations as we continue to help with the recovery efforts and bring awareness about the ongoing need to rebuild and support this impoverished country," said JBF Worldwide Founder and Executive Director, Jack Brewer. "Additionally, it is an instrumental step towards our goal of mobilizing U.S. professional athletes into various international initiatives in an effort to provide them with further knowledge and expertise as it pertains to global advocacy, cultural diversity and philanthropic endeavors. I know that many other professional athletes share my vision and are looking for

opportunities to be active participants in social change. This is one of many initiatives to expand our global network and provide tangible opportunities for our JBF Global Ambassador athletes to be involved.”

The delegates will arrive in Port-au-Prince, Haiti on Monday, May 23 where they will meet with various U.S. Embassy and Haitian Government officials along with representatives from all partnering organizations to hold a press conference regarding the week’s various programs. The scheduled press conference will take place at 2:30 p.m. at L’Athletique D’Haiti at Rue Sain Hubert, Drouillard Sarthe. Representatives will speak on the importance of using sport as a tool for development within the Latin American and Caribbean community and JBF will also provide insight on their new Sports for Development program.

Following the press conference, the team will participate along with A Ganar and IDB YOUTH in Haitian soccer and basketball legend Robert (Boby) Duval’s youth soccer program, L’Athletique D’Haiti (Athletics of Haiti). Media will have the opportunity to capture the professional athletes interacting with the children during their sport recreation activities. Founded in 1995, L’Athletique D’Haiti is a youth development program that provides underprivileged youth with a safe, clean, supportive environment where they can learn firsthand how the discipline of sports and the structure of teamwork can enhance skills, enrich lives and change futures.

On Tuesday, May 24, the team will begin their series of reconstruction programs by partnering with Un Techo para mi País (UTPMP) to build transitional houses just outside of Port-au-Prince for those who are currently homeless. UTPMP focuses on building in refugee areas, and the group will complete construction on at least two transitional houses during the two-day project.

“We are extremely excited to have hands on participation in numerous field projects this week and begin to make a lasting contribution in Haiti through our various Sports for Development initiatives,” continued Mr. Brewer. “We are truly blessed to have this opportunity and I thank all of our wonderful partners and supporters for making our dream become a reality and helping us continue to make a positive impact on those in need.”

Led by the U.S. non-profit Partners of the Americas (POA), A Ganar (Vencer in Brazil) is a youth workforce development program wrapped up in a soccer ball. By utilizing soccer and other team sports to help youth in Latin America, ages 16-24, find jobs, learn entrepreneurial skills, or re-enter the formal education system, A Ganar combats the serious problem of youth unemployment. Former soccer and basketball star, Robert Duval, president of Fondation L'Atlétique d'Haïti, leads the Haitian version of A Ganar, a programme which started as a pilot project in Brazil, Ecuador and Uruguay in 2005 and has expanded to 11 countries, working with local organizations and the POA.

A Ganar has trained over 4,000 youth in Ecuador, Brazil, Uruguay and Colombia and has now expanded to Jamaica, the Dominican Republic, St. Vincent and the Grenadines and St. Kitts and Nevis.
